Salmonella Outbreak Grows in Australia

Australia has suffered a salmonella outbreak over the past few months from frozen meal products, affecting almost 90 people. Food Stamp Changes May Jeopardize Food Security in Pennsylvania

The Trump administration proposal to eliminate broad-based categorical eligibility for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), also known as food stamps, could effect 200,000 Pennsylvanians statewide. Trump administration also proposed changes to the Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents program, which could impact SNAP access to about 92,000 Pennsylvanians. The Able-Bodied Adults rule is finalized and will take in effect in April. [Read more here.](#)



The Cost of Being Self-Sufficient in Philadelphia

About 26% of the population in Philadelphia is living at poverty level. With the future budgeting cuts and restrictions to access food assistance programs, like the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Philadelphians may be at an increased risk for hunger. It was found that for

a family of four to be self-sufficient in Philadelphia, they would need to make a salary of \$70,000. [Read the article here.](#)

Pennsylvania Department of Education Prepares for the Summer Meals and Nutrition Program

The Summer Food Service Program is a federally funded child nutrition program that helps provide nutritious meals during the summer months for low-income students. Thousands of Pennsylvanians participate in this program, and the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) is encouraging organizations to help with coordinating the program. 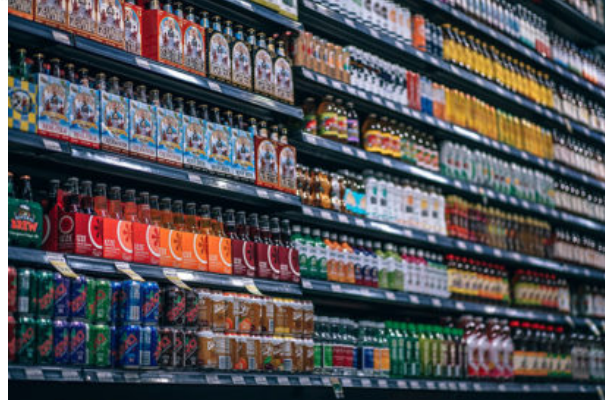
Fill a Glass with Hope® 2020 Press Release

Berkeley Celebrates 5th Anniversary of the Soda Tax

The California city's soda tax passed via ballot measure in 2014 with 76% of voters approving, making Berkeley the first city in the U.S. to implement a tax on sugary drinks. In celebration of the fifth anniversary of the ballot measure, the Praxis Project (a member of the Voices for Healthy Kids Strategic Advisory Committee) [released a video showing the city's investments from the tax.](#)



Proposal to Simplify Meal Service and Monitoring Requirements in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has proposed to make significant changes to the existing school lunch and school breakfast rules.
